Dear Sir,

I am of the view that the Hon'ble Commission would not have initiated the consultation process on the letter dt 10-12-2019, considering the considered views of the Commission recorded in para 101 (page 63) of the Tariff Order dated 10-2-2020 as follows on the implementation of Reg.no.4 of 2020, which is extracted here under:

"The views of the Commission on the above points are as below: The Commission issued Regulation 4 of 2017 with the objective of large-scale grid integration of wind and solar sources while maintaining grid stability and security, which is effective from 01.07.2018. All the reports received so far by the Commission on the implementation of the Regulation indicate a fair degree of compliance and either the licensees or the State Load Despatch Centre (SLDC) have not reported any difficulty or problem with respect to the despatch from the Wind and Solar sources or grid stability and security during the last two years.

The above table shows that the percentage of variation between the approved availability and the power actually supplied is in the range of -6% to 3% which cannot be termed as unpredictable and unreliable. In fact, it is worthwhile to note that the actual energy from Wind and Solar sources is 3% more than the Commission's approved quantity in FY2018-19."

I suggest that the Hon'ble Commission may take a preliminary view with inputs from Commission's staff or otherwise, and then a draft amendment Regulation may be published u/s 181(3) of the Electricity Act, 2003.
