During the hearing, the learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that his

client has filed a memo dated 24-07-2024 along with additional documents.

According to the learned counsel, for the period from 09-10-2019 to 31-03-2020,

the Respondents mistakenly included installed capacity in schedule-1 and that

later on realising the mistake, they have rectified by replacing the contracted capacity i.e., 700 kW and 300 kW instead of 1.30 MW & 0.550 MW. He further submitted that, for the second period that is from 01-09-2020 to 28-02-2021, the contracted capacity remained 1 MW from 24-08-2020 to 28-02-2021 for the first unit, and from 01-03-2021 up to 31-05-2021 the contracted capacity was 700 kW and that for the second unit the contracted capacity was always 300 kW. The petitioner however did not file an affidavit explaining the above facts and instead, it has only filed a cryptic memo which is not sufficient for adjudication of the case. Hence, the petitioner is directed to file a detailed affidavit explaining the purport of the document filed along with the memo. Such affidavit shall be filed within one week from today after service on the other side. Learned counsel for the respondents shall obtain instructions on such affidavit and may even file an additional counter if so so choose.
