He has also submitted an affidavit, wherein he has stated that due to precarious financial position of the respondents, the Commission's order dated 23-2-2022 could not be complied with. He requested to permit the 1st respondent to pay the amount of Rs.75.00 crores in six monthly instalments commencing from 15th June, 2022.

Mr. Shri Venkatesh, learned counsel for the petitioner, submits that his client is also in an equally precarious position, financially, if not more than the respondents. He further submits that his client has no objection if some indulgence is shown; and that the request of respondent No.1 to allow payment in six monthly instalments is highly unreasonable and the same will cause further financial distress to the petitioner-company.

Having regard to the respective pleas of the parties and keeping in view the precarious financial position of respondent No.1, and at the same time, the need for the petitioner to recover the admitted dues, we modify the previous order dated 23-2-2022 by permitting respondent No.1 to pay the sum of Rs.75.00 crores in two monthly instalments. The first instalment of Rs.40.00 crores shall be paid on or before 30-4-2022; and the balance amount of Rs.35.00 crores shall be paid on or before 31-5-2022. In the event of failure to comply with either of the two conditions, the Chairman and Managing Director of respondent No.1 shall be personally present on the next date of hearing.
