In the guise of their financial problems, the respondents cannot be allowed to put the developers into a financial crisis. As the Commission is not convinced with the bona fides of the respondents, the request for extension of time for compliance of the order dated 16-3-2022 is rejected.

The petitioner is entitled to avail consequential remedies as per law.
